WELCOME TO SEEK



What is SEEK and who is eligible:

SEEK is an academic enrichment program for school age children. Students will participate in learning experiences that are entertaining, yet academically challenging. The program will run during the weeks of June 22-26, 2009 and July 20-24, 2009. Classes begin at 8:30 a.m. and end at 4:00 p.m. Participants are escorted between classes and supervised during lunch. Children will need to bring a bag lunch (refrigeration is not available). SEEK staff will not dispense medication. The program is for students entering grades 1 through 8 for the Fall 2009 school year.

Payment can be made by check, cash, money order, MasterCard, VISA, or Discover. If paying by credit card, be sure to include all information on your registration form. Do not send cash through the mail. Make checks payable to *California University of PA*.

Fees and Refund Policies:

The fees for SEEK are as follows:
One full week, full day program is \$125 per child. One full week, half-day (morning or afternoon) program is \$80 per child. Registration is on a first-come, first-serve basis. Class size is limited, so please register early. Once registered, you will receive a confirmation letter which lists the classroom location. This must be presented on the first day of class. Withdrawal from the program must be in writing and received at least 5 working days prior to the start of the program in order to receive a full refund. No refunds will be issued for withdrawals received after June 15 for the program beginning June 22. No refunds will be issued for withdrawals received after July 13 for the program beginning July 20.

8:30 AM—10:00 AM

Crafty Kids (K1-044-S09)

This summer be a Crafty Kid! Explore your creative side while making things that you can enjoy long after SEEK ends. Some of the projects that you will complete in this class include a kite, picture frame, and puppet.

Native Americans (K1-032-S09)

Teepees, totem poles, and face painting. What would it be like to live as an American Indian? Learn all about the different tribes and how they lived, what they ate, and how they dressed. Research famous Native Americans such as Sitting Bull, Sacagawea, Squanto, and many more. Experience the Native American way of life through activities and crafts.

Who Do We Share the Planet With? (K1-052-S09)

Learn more about the creatures of the world. Discover those animals that live in various habitats and areas, on land and in water, in the tropics, and in the arctic. Play games and make crafts while learning about these animals' traits, hobbies, and habitats.

Things that Shake and Explode (K1-043-S09)
